# Marsa Alam & Southern coast – June 3/10th 2010

I have spent a week in the Brayka Bay resort in Marsa Alam, Egypt, a very nice resort where I have been before last year.

There are a lot of green fields and nice gardens and also sheltered areas with trees where birds can feed and hide.

Besides spending a "normal" holiday (but always with my binoculars) my intention was to twitch the Lappet-faced Vulture in Bir Shalatin and the Crab Plover that I did not find in Hamata or in any expected site along the coast south of Marsa Alam.

I was not expecting to see migrating passerines but surprisingly a small amount of them were still on their route up north.

Best birding hours were, of course, early in the morning when everything was still quiet, while I spent the daytime hours for some sea-watching or walk outside the hotel to find more species as raptors or larks.

The temperature was between 30 to 36°C and visibility was always excellent.

The bird guides used were:

List of species seen:

**Brown Booby\*** - (*Sula leucogaster*) One adult fishing just in front of Wadi El Gemal reserve on June 7th

**Striated Heron** - (*Butorides striatus*) One adult in Wadi El Gemal mangroves, *ssp brevipes*, on 7th

#### Squacco Heron - (Ardeola ralloides)

Seen daily in Brayka Bay resort – adults and immatures max 2 per day + 1 adult in Wadi El Gemal

**Cattle Egret** - (*Bubulcus ibis*) Seen daily at the resort – max 6 together

## Western Reef Heron - (Egretta gularis)

White and dark phase seen in the lagoon of the resort - seen daily 1-2 birds

### White Stork - (Ciconia ciconia)

One adult bird flying over the resort on June 8th

#### Black Kite - (Milvus migrans)

One immature bird seen on June 6th flying low just outside the resort.

**Egyptian Vulture** – (Neophron percnopterus) One adult + 1 juvenile in Bir Shalatin on the  $7^{th}$ 

# Lappet-faced Vulture\* - (Torgos tracheliotus)

Six birds seen in Bir Shalatin - 3 feeding on dead camel + 3 flying over

# Steppe Eagle - (Aquila nipalensis)

One subad. flying north above the resort on the 4th

#### **Osprey** - (Pandion haliaetus)

One bird seen daily at resort + 2 in Wadi Lahami and Wadi El Gemal.

## **Sooty Falcon** \* - (Falco concolor)

One very swift adult hunting doves just before dusk on the 4<sup>th</sup> at resort

**Lanner Falcon** - *(Falco biarmicus)* Three specimen recorded.

#### **Kentish Plover** - (*Charadrius alexandrinus*) One juvenile/female seen on the 7<sup>th</sup> in Wadi El Gemal

**Greater Sand Plover** - *(Charadrius leschenaultii)* Five birds in Wadi El Gemal

#### **Spur-winged Plover** - (Hoplopterus spinosus)

Three couples in the resort – 1 very aggressive couple with 3 adorable pulli + 1 with eggs.

## **Common Sandpiper** - (Actitis hypoleucos)

One single bird outside the resort in Marsa Alam on the 9<sup>th</sup>

#### **Sooty Gull** - (Larus hemprichii)

Seen daily in small groups - bigger numbers close to Shams Alam trash dump.

#### White-eyed Gull - (Larus leucophthalmus)

Common – seen daily in small groups – about 100 birds seen around Shams Alam trash dump on the  $7^{\rm th}.$

#### **Caspian Tern** - *(Hydroprogne caspia)* Seen daily passing in front of the resort – up to 5 birds on the 4<sup>th</sup>

#### **Sandvich Tern** – (Sterna sandicensis) One bird among Lesser Crested Terns on the 8<sup>th</sup> close by the resort.

**Lesser Crested Tern** - (Sterna bengalensis) Common – seen daily in small flocks passing by or fishing – up t0 30 birds on the  $8^{th}$ 

#### **Common Tern** - (Sterna hirundo) Seen 3 birds on the $4^{th}$ and 2 on the $8^{th}$

White-cheeked Tern - (Sterna repressa) 4 adults fishing in mixed flock with Common and L. Crested Terns on the 4<sup>th</sup>

**Spotted Sandgrouse** - (*Pterocles senegallus*) 1 male along the road close to Berenice on 7th

### **Rock Dove** - *(Columba livia)* Seen daily outside the resort in small flocks

**Eurasian Collared Dove** - (*Streptopelia decaocto*) Common in the resort

**Laughing Dove** - *(Streptopelia senegalensis)* Very common in the resort and seen everywhere where trees were

# Namaqua Dove - (Oena capensis)

One cute tiny female seen on the  $10^{th}$  at resort, very shy.

**Pallid Swift** - (*Apus pallidus*) 2 birds flying over the resort on the 5<sup>th</sup>

**European Bee-eater** - (Merops apiaster) Common – seen daily up to 50 birds on the 6<sup>th</sup>

#### **Sand Martin** - (*Riparia riparia*)

Two birds seen, on  $5^{th}$  and 4 on the  $10^{th}$ , among Barn Swallow and Bee Eaters.

**Rock Martin** - (*Ptyonoprogne fuligula*) A pair seen daily; nesting in abandoned building close to the resort.

**Barn Swallow** - (*Hirundo rustica*) Seen daily, all females.

**Red-rumped Swallow** - (Cecropis daurica) One bird seen on the  $5^{th}$  at resort and 1 on the  $10^{th}$  close to the airport.

**Common House Martin** - (Delichon urbicum) Five birds seen on the 5<sup>th</sup> **Tawny Pipit** - *(Anthus campestris)* One in Wadi Lahami.

Yellow Wagtail - (Motacilla flava)

One female ssp feldegg at resort seen on the 9th and 10th

**Rufous-tailed Scrub Robin\*** - (Cercotrichas galactotes) One adult seen at resort on  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$

**Common Redstart** - *(Phoenicurus phoenicurus)* One female on the 4<sup>th</sup> at resort and 2 males on the 8<sup>th</sup> at resort as well.

#### White-crowned Wheatear - (Oenanthe leucopyga)

A couple seen everyday feeding in the gardens and nesting outside the resort + 1 juvenile at resort.

**Eurasian Reed Warbler** - (Acrocephalus scirpaceus) Four birds seen on the 6<sup>th</sup> at resort.

**Marsh Warbler** - (Acrocephalus palustris) Two birds on the 5<sup>th</sup>

**Eastern Olivaceous Warbler** - (*Hippolais pallida*) Seen almost daily up to 3 birds at resort + 1 in Marsa Hemira with 2 Upcher's Warbler.

#### **Upcher's Warbler** - (Hippolais languida)

Two in Marsa Hemira mangroves with 1 Olivaceous Warbler – seen very well to appreciate the difference between the two species in size and color.

**Garden Warbler** - (Sylvia borin) Seen daily at resort – up to 2 birds.

**Lesser Whitethroat** - *(Sylvia curruca)* Only 2 on the 4<sup>th</sup> at resort.

# Common Whitethroat - (Sylvia communis)

One on the  $5^{th}$  and 1 on the  $8^{th}$  at resort – both females/ $1^{st}$  summer.

**Eurasian Golden Oriole** - *(Oriolus oriolus)* One female/1<sup>st</sup> summer in Wadi Lahami mangroves.

**Masked Shrike** - (*Lanius nubicus*) A couple seen daily at resort – no signs of nesting.

**Brown-necked Raven** - *(Corvus ruficollis)* Very common – tens seen in Bir Shalatin.

## Yellow-throated Sparrow - (Petronia xanthocollis)

The highlight of this trip as if accepted is the  $1^{st}$  record for this species in Egypt. One singing male seen on the  $5^{th}$ ;  $6^{th}$  and  $9^{th}$  at the resort or just outside it on Palm, Eucalyptus or Acacia tree.

Call very similar to House Sparrow. Very shy.
