CYPRUS

Horned Grebe Podiceps auritus. Two offshore
Kouklia (Paphos) 16 November-5
December 2017 with one remaining until
7 February 2018 (A McArthur, Plate 1).
Third record.

Levant Sparrowhawk Accipiter brevipes. An adult Anarita park 16 April 2017 (J Willson). A juvenile Timi 16 September 2017 (M Smith) and another juvenile Phasouri 2 October 2017 (R Howard, K Howard, P Chambers, A Chambers).

Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva. One adult Larnaca sewage treatment plant (STP) 21 October 2017 (S Christoudoulides). Ninth record.

Terek Sandpiper *Xenus cinereus*. One Larnaca STP 31 August 2017 (C Rixen, C Rueffler). 14th record since 2000.

Black-winged Pratincole Glareola nordmanni.
One Polis Chrysochou bay 28 April 2017
(R Dobbins) and another Larnaca STP area 26 October 2017 (S Christodoulides).
Rare, less than annual passage migrant.

Black-legged Kittiwake *Rissa tridactyla.* An adult Paphos headland 12 November 2017 (T Drew). Eighth record.

Oriental Turtle Dove Streptopelia orientalis.
One Mandria (Paphos) 22 March 2017 (C Richardson). Second record.

Little Swift Apus affinis. One Afrendika 17 March 2017 (D Bratt), one Oroklini marsh 18 March 2017 (M Lanaway, S Bosworth) and two 15 September 2017 (C Richardson). 20th–22nd records.

Steppe Grey Shrike Lanius (excubitor) pallidirostris. One Armou hills 23

September 2017 (C Richardson). 16th record.

Bar-tailed Lark Ammomanes cinctura. One cape Drepanum 7 April 2017 (S Mann) and another cape Greco 12–14 April 2017 (B Hafbauer, C Hafbauer, E Roy, Plate 2). 5th–6th records.

Yellow-browed Warbler Phylloscopus inornatus. One ringed Prodromos 24 October 2017 (M Moysi) and one Armou hills 31 October 2017 (C Richardson). 18th–19th records.

Marsh Warbler Acrocephalus palustris.
Two ringed individuals: one Kouklia (Paphos) 23 September 2017 (C Lamsdell, D Lamsdell) and another Neo Horio 24 September 2017 (M Moysi). Rare, less than annual passage migrant.

Asian Desert Warbler *Sylvia nana.* Two Akrotiri salt lake 25 February 2017 (N Papanikolas). 17th record.

White-throated Robin Irania gutturalis. A male cape Greco 22 April 2017 (F Georgiades). 20th record.

European Pied Flycatcher Ficedula hypoleuca. One Troodos 12 September 2017 (I Bloomer, K Bloomer). Passage migrant, rare in autumn.

'Caspian Stonechat' Saxicola maurus hemprichii. One Avakas coast, Paphos 27 March 2017 (A Saunders), one Polis 30 March 2017 (R Dobbins) and another Paphos STP 30 October 2017 (T Drew, E Drew). Rare, less than annual passage migrant.

Western Siberian Stonechat Saxicola maurus. One Kouklia (Paphos) 5 November 2017. (T Drew, E Drew). Rare, less than annual passage migrant.

Rock Sparrow Petronia petronia. One cape Greco 2 November 2017 (T Drew, E Drew). At least 12th record.

Yellow-headed Wagtail Motacilla (flava) lutea. One Agia Napa football fields 3 September 2017 (C Rixen, C Rueffler). 9th recent record.

Asian Crimson-winged Finch Rhodopechys sanguineus. One rescued from pet shop in Limassol. It had been trapped previously there and was ringed and released Phasouri 14 February 2017 (CRC). 4th record.

Trumpeter Finch Bucanetes githagineus.
One cape Greco 22 April 2017 (S Christodoulides), one Akrotiri gravel pits 13 May 2017 (S Christodoulides) and another Tomb of the Kings archaeological site, Paphos 4 November 2017 (T Drew, E Drew).

Little Bunting Emberiza pusilla. One ringed Polis reedbeds 4 April 2017 (R Dobbins) and another Latchi 3 November 2017 (T Drew, E Drew). 5th–6th records.

EGYPT

EORC has accepted the following records since the report in *Sandgrouse* 36(2).

Balearic Shearwater Puffinus mauretanicus. One Zaraniq, east end of Bardawil lagoon, North Sinai, 17 August 1981 (U Sørensen, I Petersen). First record.

African Openbill Anastomus lamelligerus. Two river Nile 20 km north of Kom Ombo, 31 May 2013 (J Quilter). Second record.

Yellow Bittern *Ixobrychus sinensis*. Two trapped Wadi Lahami, Red sea, 26 April

2012 and one trapped 9 May 2012 (M Päckert, J Hering *et al*).Two males trapped in 2012 subsequently trapped July 2013 and found to have brood patches; three nests found, with egg shells. First record and first breeding record.

Wahlberg's Eagle Hieraaetus wahlbergi. One pale morph juvenile Ras Shukeir, Red sea coast, 3 May 2013 (Ahmed Waheed, Ibraheem Saad). First record.

Tawny Eagle *Aquila rapax*. One juvenile between Marsa Alam and Edfu, 8 May 2015 (Lars Andersen & Martin Thomsen, Plate 3). First record.

Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse Syrrhaptes exustus. Sandgrouse 36(2) reported the rediscovery of this species in March 2012 near Sandafa in Minya governorate, subsequently confirmed by numerous observations. Following this discovery, an observer living in Elba national park reported five birds of this species coming to drink in mixed sandgrouse flocks (with Pterocles coronatus and P. senegallus) at Jebel Elba in the Halaib Triangle in June 2013 with subsequent observations 2014–2017 (maximum 50 October 2014 and April 2015) (Ali Dourah). EORC considers that

this species is regularly present in the national park.

'Siberian' Buff-bellied Pipit Anthus (rubescens) japonicus. Sandgrouse 35(1) reported the acceptance of the first record of an individual at Naama Bay sewage works, Sharm el Sheikh, Sinai 11–13 January 2009. Photographic evidence subsequently submitted has enabled EORC to accept that there were three individuals rather than a single bird present at the site during this period. There are therefore three records of 'Siberian' Buff-bellied Pipit in Egypt, involving six individuals.

Pied Crow Corvus albus. One Gebel Elba, Elba national park, Halaib Triangle, 2–3 April 2015 (Ali Dora). First record.

Black Scrub Robin Cercotrichas podobe.
One Wadi Kiraaf, Hadarba, Gebel Elba,
Elba national park, 23 November and 13
December 2014 (Ali Dora). Not attributed
to subspecies, either podobe breeding
across the Sahel or melanoptera on the
Arabian peninsula. Sixth record.

Menetries's Warbler Sylvia mystacea. One male Wadi Gemal, 12 March 2015 (A Bujanowicz). Sixth record.

Long-eared Owl Asio otus. Two Mutla'a ranch, 17 November 2017 (P Jansen, M Kviesgaard), two Al Abraq 17 February 2018 (Sajan). Eighth–ninth records.

- Mesopotamian Crow Corvus (cornix) capellanus. One Pivot fields, 17 February 2018 (M Pope). Third record.
- **Grey-throated Martin** *Riparia paludicola*. One JPR, 24 November 2017 (M Craig). First record.

Mute Swan *Cygnus olor.* Two immatures Jebel Dhanna plantation 15 December 2017 (K Al Dhaheri). Fifth record, last 2003.

Great White Pelican Pelecanus onocrotalus. One juvenile Ra's al-Khor mangrove hide 24 February–12 May 2018 (C Valdez *et al*). Tenth record, last 2017.

Spotted Sandgrouse Pterocles senegallus. Six Saih al Salam oasis lakes 14 January 2018 (L Esselen) and two there 19 January (M Smiles). Sixth record, last 2009.

Arabian Spotted Eagle Owl Bubo (africanus) milesi. One Hajar mountains 1 November 2017 and two birds there 18 April 2018 (A Stoquert, S Majid, J Judas et al). First record, but subsequent fieldwork has established it as a scarce and inconspicuous resident in the Hajar mountains. c10 territories located by May 2018 (A Stoquert, J Judas et al).

Black Drongo Edolius macrocercus. One Mushrif national park 28 Oct 2017 onwards (N Riddiford), possibly the returning bird from 2015/2016. One Abu Dhabi golf club 3 December 2017 (S Lloyd). 10th–11th records, last 2016.

Calandra Lark *Melanocorypha calandra*. Eight Sila'a 2 December 2017 (S Lloyd). Two Wamm farms 8 December 2017–26 January 2018 (O Campbell, M Smiles *et al*). 10th–11th records, last 2015.

Streak-throated Swallow Petrochelidon fluvicola. One Al Zorah nursery 24 December 2017 (K Al Dhaheri) and probably same bird Ajman STP 29 December 2017 (M Smiles). Five Ajman STP 12 January 2018, last seen (one) 29 January 2018 (J Judas et al). 10th–11th records, last 2013.

Yellow-browed Warbler Phylloscopus inornatus. One Mushrif Palace gardens 25 October 2017 (S Lloyd), one Al Mamzar park 28 October 2017 (M Smiles, D Wadsworth), one Wadi Bih 21 January 2018 (Y Gisseleire). 17th–19th records, last 2017.

Moustached Warbler Acrocephalus melanopogon. One Saih al Salam, Al Qudra lake, 20 December 2017–4 Jan 2018 (R Khan et al). One Al Wathba wetland reserve 27 January 2018 (J Delannoy, N Moran et al). 18th–19th records, last 2014.

- **Fieldfare** *Turdus pilaris*. One Jebel Dhanna housing area 18 November 2017 (K Al Dhaheri). Sixth record, last 1990.
- 'Caspian Stonechat' Saxicola maurus hemprichii. One Al Qudra pivot fields, 30 November 2017 (O Campbell). Rare but regular in spring, two previous autumn records.
- 'East Siberian Wagtail' Motacilla (alba) ocularis. One Saadiyat island golf course 7

November 2017 (J Partridge, Plate 4). First record of this subspecies.
